Outreach and Mobilization Position 20 hours per week / 35 weeks

Breast Cancer Action Quebec, a women's health group dedicated to the prevention of breast cancer and the promotion of environmental health, is looking for an outreach and mobilization worker for our toxics education and legislative reform projects.

As a member of a small but dynamic team, the outreach and mobilization worker will coordinate contact with women's, youth and community organizations across Quebec to promote our toxics education program and our mobilization project during the federal elections. She¹ will promote use of our elections toolkit on reform of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act. She will also liaise with youth groups on our environmental health program to put together groups of girls for workshops offering training to become environmental health leaders.

Skills required: excellent communication skills, excellent written and spoken French, well-organized, autonomy, creativity, good team worker, experience with collective actions or political campaigns, readiness to be trained on issues of toxic substances and environmental health issues. Knowledge of the women's, youth or community movements is helpful. Spoken English is helpful.

We recognize and value the contributions that individuals who identify as members of marginalized and oppressed communities bring to our organization and strongly encourage them to apply.

The contract runs for 35 weeks (March 4, 2019 to Nov. 2, 2019), 20 hours per week at \$22. While there is some flexibility in work organization, the candidate must be free to work in the office at least on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Ideal for a graduate student interested in and with experience in community organizations, political campaigns or mobilizations.
