Main Responsibilities:

- Animate and facilitate the workshops within the assigned community/communities
- Collaborate effectively with the Kativik Ilisarniliriniq School Board staff.
- Provide on-the-job support and feedback according to the workshops' stated objectives.
- Use effective communication skills to build trust and rapport and maintain effective working relationships with participants;
- Work in collaboration with other facilitators.

Purpose:

The Vanier workshops for Kativik Ilisarniliriniq technicians provide participants with practical information and hands-on training to help them develop more skills and knowledge in their jobs as special education technicians and behavioural technicians. The workshops serve to help increase the technicians' ability to be more effective in their roles with students.

A series six workshops are offered; five of which are offered within the fourteen communities in the Nunavik region of Quebec. The workshop topics include:

- 1.The Role of the Technician in KI Schools;
- 2.Building Trusting Relationships with Students;
- 3.Communicating with Upset Students; 4.Documenting and Communicating Student Behaviours;
- 5.Taking Care of Yourself as a Professional Responsibility.

A final sixth workshop is offered in Montreal whereby the participants are given the opportunity to visit different fieldwork settings to expand their awareness of existing models.



Personal Qualifications and Skills

- Knowledge of the role a behaviour technician and special education technician within schools;
- Awareness of Inuit culture and realities of Nunavik;
- Experience working with youth with learning and behavioural challenges;
- Asset: post-secondary courses in social science/education field and/or equivalent education and work experience;
- Knowledge and experience with the Special Care Counseling program and/or graduates of the program;
- Trauma-informed awareness;
- Strong facilitation skills with proven ability to be creative and engaging;
- Comfort leading discussions and presenting information to groups;
- Strong spoken English, experience with second language learning adaptations;
- Ability to work autonomously and in a team;
- Highly flexible and adaptable to unexpected changes in schedule.



Working Conditions

The ideal candidate is able to commit to delivering 19 weeks of workshops between August 2022 to June 2023, 18 of which will be in Nunavik. Candidates will spend two weeks at a time in various communities of Nunavik, and then return to Montreal for a week or two before resuming the cycle in a new community. Ideal candidates will be committed to the success of this project long term.

Hours of work: 8 hour days

Salary: Fixed hourly rate with certain benefits – non-unionized position

Other: Accommodations, travel expenses and per diem covered by Kativik Ilisarniliriniq.
